2022 CUPBOARD IMPACT REPORT

Thanks to supporters of the Cupboard Campaign, Crittenton was able to help our girls—and their families—when they needed it most. We turned to our virtual pantry of supplies and emergency funding to help Jahniya and her boys move to a safer apartment, to send Ahimya on a college tour, to provide PPE supplies during the Omicron surge, to help Hownisha keep her car running so she could get from her home in Anacostia to her job in NE DC, and for rent assistance for Naomi’s family after her father fell ill with covid and missed several days of work.

And when one of our families—who struggle themselves—took in two girls whose mother couldn’t care for them, we dipped into the Cupboard to help with clothing and basic supplies.

Finally, for the first time ever, Crittenton was able to proactively send girls home for the summer with period products that would enable them to fully participate in a well-earned summer vacation.

\$500 for part of a security deposit for an alumna in Gaithersburg

\$600 for a college tour for a DC senior

\$2,000 for PPE supplies for our girls and their families

\$300 for car repairs for an alumna in SE DC

\$500 for rent assistance in Montgomery County

\$750 for basic clothing, formula and supplies for two girls taken in by a Crittenton family

\$2,350 for period products to tide girls over during Summer
