<u>Teen Girls Consistently Approach Us And Say, "I</u> <u>Want To Be A Crittenton Girl!"</u>

During the 2022 to 2023 school year, Crittenton had its highest participation numbers ever. You may be wondering what draws a girl to our programs. Every girl wants to be accepted, seen, and supported. A girl steps into one of our groups and in that moment, she can feel the shift of entering a safe space. The judgments, pressures, and challenges she faces at school and home become relatable and less daunting; the feelings of having an adult she can go to and trust slowly become the norm; and her belief that she can achieve anything she puts her mind to becomes her reality. This is what it means to be in one of Crittenton's programs.

A Strategic Planning Process

Crittenton's team formed a strategic planning committee and have conducted several listening sessions with school partners, investors, staff, board of directors, and Crittenton alumnae. Our school partners expressed the positive changes in girls from the presence of our groups. Investors of Crittenton shared that we are the only organization doing what we do, and how we do it, for the girls we serve. One of our school's principals went as far as saying, "Whatever it is you're doing in the classroom, it's magical." Our alumnae recounted their incredible experiences in our program and encouraged our team to think big for Crittenton's future of serving teen girls and what tripling our impact should look like.

Impact Timeline

FY 2024 and 2025 mark pivotal moments for laying our foundations, strengthening our capabilities, and innovating new systems, processes, and community initiatives. These efforts will set the stage for our next leap forward in FY 2026 and 2027: expanding Crittenton's middle school to high school feeder model into additional counties, wards, and cities across the region. With all the extraordinary opportunities on the horizon, Crittenton's team is energized and committed to elevating the standards for positive youth development everywhere we go.

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

Equips 7th to 12th grade girls with the tools they need to navigate the choices and challenges of adolescence. It teaches girls about healthy relationships with their peers, dating partners, and parents; positive communication; reproductive health and pregnancy prevention; "adulting" skills; and postsecondary education and career options. It also enables them to acquire skills essential for college readiness and personal success.



GOAL SETTING GIRLS

Strengthens the social and emotional skills that middle school girls need to succeed in school and as firstgenerationcollege students. It uses goal setting as an entry point to deliver an evidence-based social and emotional development curriculum. It also uses projectbased learning to introduce STEM careers, connects participants to academic support, and provides training for parents to strengthen their support for their daughters' education.

PEARLS

Parenting Education And Responsive Life Skills

Enables pregnant and parenting high school students to succeed as students and parents. It offers teen parents a support system as they learn how to balance the competing responsibilities of parenthood and education. Pregnant and parenting teens learn about healthy pregnancy, labor, and delivery; managing stress; infant and child development, positive parenting skills, and child care and safety; healthy relationships, co-parenting, and positive communications; reproductive health; and postsecondary education and careers.



I think this program should keep going because some students don't trust or are not comfortable with some staff at their schools. If they had a group like this, I think they would feel more at home."





"I am in Goal Setting Girls and I really appreciate everything and all the fun activities in this program. I am the vice president of my GSG 7th grade group and I hope that our program continues to get funds in the future because girls need a safe space to have girl talk. Our program leader is someone I can always count on and she is there when I need a shoulder to cry on. She is an adult that we all trust in the school."

"I am in 7th grade and I am thankful for you as a councilmember because you are people of color who understand that teens like us need programs like Goal Setting Girls. Goal setting girls has helped me be more confident in myself and make healthy friendships."

Crittenton's 2023 High Tea was a huge success! We gathered 100 community leaders and 100 Crittenton girls in a unique networking and mentoring experience. This event featured a powerful student panel where four Crittenton girls openly discussed important topics effecting teen girls today.

Their poise when speaking with community leaders was inspiring. They navigated sensitive subjects, like gender biases and generational trauama, with grace. These courageous conversations made a huge impact on the girls and community leaders in the room.

We closed the afternoon by honoring 10 Crittenton Scholars with award certificates for their academic achievements.

CRITTENTON SCHOLARS

Before joining a Crittenton program, a vast majority of girls don't understand how many opportunities are possible for them and the steps to take in order to get into college.

The Crittenton Scholarship Fund was established in 2020 to support Crittenton girls who are first- generation college students in need of financial aid. The current Crittenton Scholarships are the Kovar/McBride Scholarship and the V&S Foundation Scholarship, with <u>over 43 girls</u> receiving aid to pursue their academic dreams since their inception.

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


